2016-17 School LAND Trust Report
Amount Allocated: \$98,636

The use of school LAND Trust money is determined by the Lehi High School Community Council (for more information about School Community Council - SCC, visit <https://goo.gl/mcW3SA>), and it is based on the School Improvement Plan.

The 2016-2017 School Improvement Plan focused on raising the achievement level of students below proficiency. The areas of focus for the School Improvement Plan were to increase student performance in Secondary Math I/ II, Physics and Chemistry, support teacher professional development, and maintain graduation rate of 93%.

Lehi High used LAND Trust funds to support academic needs in the following ways:

- Funded three full-time student advocates to monitor student progress in class and in graduate credit.
- Funded one full-time math aide to assist in four support classes for Math and Science.
- Funded one full-time attendance aide
- Funded digital studies program to help students in need of credit recovery

Teachers at Lehi High continue to work to improve academic performance and growth in all subjects.

Student testing measures will be compared, disseminated, and used to guide decisions with LAND Trust money. With our continued efforts as a School Community Council, LHS has maintained graduation rates, developed teacher learning, and improved student academic performance and student achievement.
